IIT satellite campus; Youth Cong flays Govt

BHUBANESWAR: The Pradesh Youth Congress has criticised the Government for its failure to persuade the Centre to set up a satellite campus of IIT Kharagpur at Bhubaneswar.

Addressing media persons here on Monday, president of the State unit Youth Congress Rohit Pujari alleged that the campus was finally set up in West Bengal because of the inefficiency of the BJD-BJP Government.

Stating that IIT Kharagpur has announced plans to open another campus soon, Pujari advised the State Government to lobby for its establishment in Orissa. The second campus may also go to another State, if the Government delays further, he said.

Since IIT Kharagpur has an extension centre in Bhubaneswar where they offer PG diploma in information technology and would shortly open diploma in intellectual property law, the State Government should seriously pursue for the establishment of the campus at Bhubaneswar, he said.

Pujari said the State Government should also pursue IIT Delhi for opening one of its campuses at Rourkela. Similarly, IIT Chennai and Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore should be approached by the Government for campuses at Berhampur.

Earlier, Pujari called on Governor Rameshwar Thakur and demanded a CBI probe into alleged child trafficking by some orphanages.

wake of a spate of recent bank dacoity cases, miscreants looted about Rs 50,000 at gun-point from the employees of Ramamani Petrol Pump of Khandagiri on Monday. Unofficial sources, however, put the amount at more than a lakh.

The incident took place just 200 metres away from the petrol pump on National Highway No. 5 at around 10.45 am. Two employees of the pump were heading towards UCO Bank, CRPF branch in a car when the miscreants -- believed to be three in number and riding a motorcycle -- stopped them and snatched the bag with the amount, police said.

However, the miscreants left the other bag, which had around Rs 4 lakh cash, police informed.

They fled the spot immediately and have left their bike on the Khandagiri-Chandaka Road when a Police Control Room (PCR) van chased them, police said, adding, a search operation being carried out in Damapada-Bharatpur forests.

About four sections of police were engaged in the operation. No one has been arrested so far. Police have sealed all the exit points.
